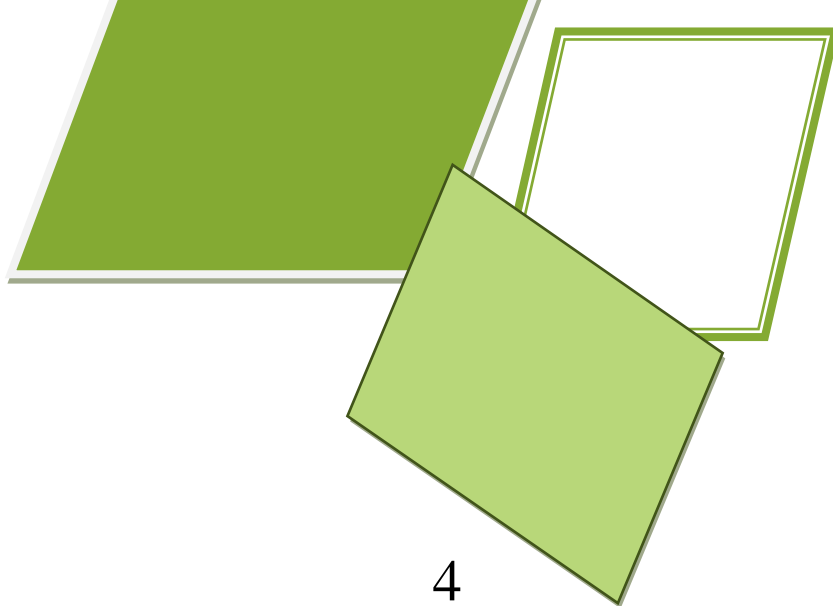
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Joy Foundation Strategic Direction

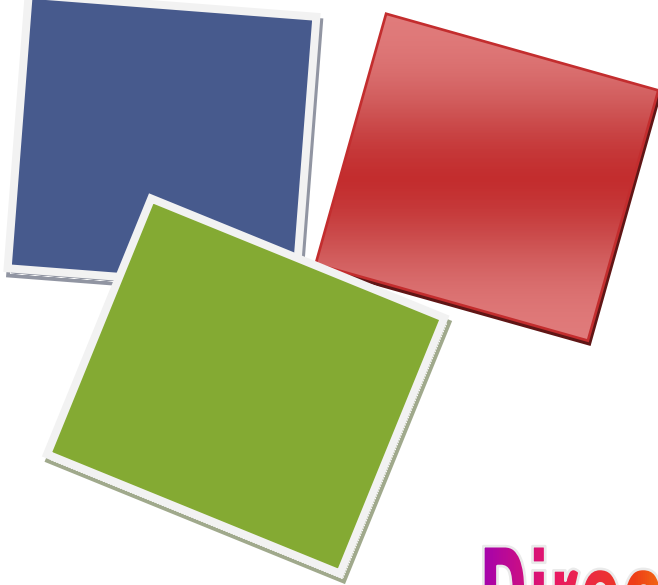
Vision:

Chak No 325 Toba Tek Singh



Joy Foundation is running a Formal Education School from 2 year in Chak No 325, Toba Tek Singh. The school is growing day by day.

After the examinations children have moved to next class, new admissions opened and new children are enrolled into the school. Prizes were given to children who took positions. All the books, copies and stationary material for both classes were provided by Joy Foundation.



The teachers of the school are doing a great job and contributing a lot for the school and community. The community is happy with the efforts of Joy Foundation. We are looking forward to provide the best education to the children in this community.

Provision of Solar Panels in School

As the village has no electricity many parents refused to send their children to school before, which not only badly affected the schools strength but was also a great loss for children as it was affecting their education. Joy Foundation installed 2 solar panels in the school which are now fulfilling the electricity needs of the school.

After the provision of electricity in the school children are now regularly attending the classes. The teachers told that it is now much easy for them to teach the children in school as fans are a great facility in summers and it is also comfortable for children to study in properly lighten classrooms.

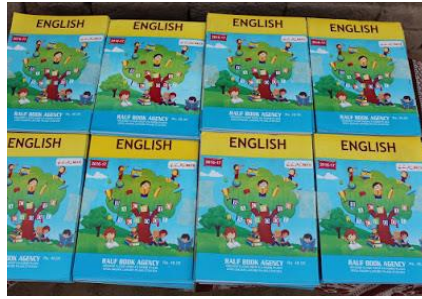


Parents Counseling Meetings

The Director, Sir Yaqoob Sadiq along with the staff of Joy Foundation visited the villages and conducted these meetings.

We all experience moments of uncertainty about how to balance the needs of our various family members, teach our kids the skills they need, provide consistent discipline, and manage our children's moods. A relaxed, informative and interactive way to involve in your child's educational life is by improving communication, developing positive and effective discipline, and nurturing children's self-confidence and focus on key skills like loving, listening, speaking, coaching, enforcing the limits and building confidence in your children.

Story from the Community



Sajid Masih and his Wife Andeela Bibi are living in the village Dullam (Chak 325 JB), Toba Tek Singh. They have 2 children, a girl and a boy. The girls name is Fiza Sajid, 6 years old, and she wants to become a teacher (like her school teacher). The boys name is Narosh Sajid, 4 years old, and he wants to become a doctor.

Both their children are studying in our Joy Foundation School. Their house is a big empty plot with 2 trees in it, only one room, one kitchen and a washroom in it. Sajid Masih is the only earning hand in the family and is working as a laborer in the city and earns very less. His wife is now getting training in our Sewing Centre and will soon after completing her training will help her husband in the income of family.

They are happy that they have school in village which is free for their children and their children are happy to getting education in their own village.

Child Sponsorship Program



Joy Foundation child sponsorship program is a continuous project since 2009.under this project joy foundation sponsors those children whose parents can't afford their education expenses. Every year new children are added to this program.20 children were being supported by this program in 2015 and this year Joy Foundation added 2new children. Now Joy Foundation is sponsoring 22 children through its child sponsorship program. We believe we make a living by what we get, but we make a life with what we give, our slight positive influence has the potential to change child's life, so providing opportunities to our future is what Joy Foundation takes stand for.



Case Study

Joy Foundation has been sponsoring Nisha since 2012. Nisha was in class 2 when we started sponsoring her. Her father was not able to bear her educational expenses as they were poor and Nisha was studying in a private school. Thereon Joy Foundation decided to sponsor Nisha. His yearly fees, expenses of books school bag and stationary, water bottle and lunch box all of her educational expenses are being covered by Joy Foundation. Now she is studying in 6th grade in the same private school. Her family is very thankful to Joy Foundation for supporting their daughter Nisha said, without Joy Foundation I would not have reached here, I thanks Joy Foundation for providing me assistance and support to continue my education. All these years Nisha has been a very good student and Joy Foundation is proud to sponsor her.

Cooperation Circle with URI

“Peaceful Co- Existence among the Religious Communities”

The Christian study centre (CSC) Rawalpindi is an organization that has been working to promote interfaith dialogue peace and harmony in the country. Christian Study Centre initiated the project on “Peaceful co-existence among the Religion Communities” in four districts of Punjab Pakistan from January 2011-march 2013 in the four areas of district Faisalabad (Jhumra, Tandlianwala, samundri and Jaranwala) and later from April 2014-December 2016 two other Tehsil is added which Tehsil Nankana Sahib and Tehsil Gojra

After that in the next phase was initiated in January 2017.in this phase Christian Study Centre expanded its project area to Toba Tek Singh .It is a three year project (2017-2019) titled peaceful Co-existence among religious Communities. It is the third phase of the project. Before starting the project CSC visit all the organizations in Toba Tek Singh and select five organizations as partner for this project and Joy Foundation is one who select by CSC among these five partners.

After selection of the partners In the beginning of the project CSC call all five partners for the TOTs training in Rawalpindi and they have follow up meeting after three months. In which they ask partners to send different stakeholders for the training which will support the partners and CSC for this project in Toba Tek Singh. CSC along with their partners organization give training to Religious, women and youth leaders, social activists and Journalists

Activities

Focus Group

CSC selected five (5) partner organizations from the new target area Tehsil Toba Tek Singh to implement a three year project in the respective area. Afterwards the partner organizations were invited for the focus group discussion on March 30th 2017 at CSC ten participants from five partner organizations attended the program. The project team welcomed the participants and shared the main goal and objectives of the project with them. In order to give thorough understanding of the context of their area, a situational analysis was conducted with the participants. The participants were divided into two groups to identify the social, political, cultural, religious and economic issues of their area and seek ways of how to address these issues.

The participants highlighted issues of human rights violation, gender discrimination, family conflicts, injustice, political instability, poverty, unemployment, and lack of resources and the presence of a strong class system. Sectarianism was also highlighted. The partners suggested that awareness seminars and workshops on interfaith harmony, peace building and human rights were needed to change the mindsets of the people. They also emphasized engaging with the youth of the area in healthy and positive activities.

Training of Trainers Workshop (TOT)

CSC conducted a training of trainers workshop for five (5) selected partner organizations of Tehsil Toba Tek Singh from April 24th -27th to build up the capacity of the partner organizations on various themes. The contents of the training were formulated in the light of the feedback and brainstorming of the focus group discussion. Learned resource persons were invited to the training sessions were conducted on interfaith harmony, human rights conflict Resolution skills, alternative Dispute resolution technique (ADR) and strategic peace building. They made their sessions interactive by using the relevant audio/video aids. Group discussions and presentations by the participants was also the methodology used.

Additionally an exposure visit to different worship places was arranged. The group was taken to the Faisal mosque, Christ church and Krishna mandir. They learnt about the faith practices and rituals of the respective faith traditions. They also visited the famous lok virsa (folk heritage museum) to perceive the culture of different provinces of Pakistan. On the last day of the training the participant, organization always worked on a three month action plan i.e., on the activities they would conduct in their areas they shared their plans with the other group members of the areas.



Follow – up Workshop



The project team arranged a follow-up workshop for the participants of the TOT from July 17th -19th 2017 at CSC in which the partner organizations were invited to share the outcomes of the activities they had arranged in their areas in accordance with their action plan. While sharing the outcomes of the activities, they said that most of the participants appreciated the theme of interfaith harmony particularly as in their view it would work to bring the people of different faiths and sects together, expressing their own observation,

The partners shared that although people are aware of the concept of interfaith harmony yet they do not have a deeper understanding of it which can motivate them to take initiatives towards resolving the religious driven issues. Therefore we need to arrange such awareness programs that can clarify their understanding and concepts on interfaith harmony and then help them to take initiatives on positive lines.

As part of the project procedure each partner signed the memorandum of understanding (MOU) with CSC. By signing the partners and CSC together commit that they shall continue the journey of peace and harmony together.



Training with women

To engage women in the intervention a training session with a group of women was organized in their home town Toba Tek Singh from October 24th -25th 2017 in which 25 women from different spheres of life participated. The objective of the training was to develop their understanding on the themes of interfaith human rights gender issues.

Peace building and women's role in nation building. They were also motivated to share their thoughts in group discussions and presentations. They were encouraged to become a part of the peace committees as well.

Youth Training



Pakistan is a country where over 60 % of the population consists of youth .In order to engage the youth of the area in positive and constructive activities ,CSC organized a training workshop for youth Leaders from 7th - 9th august ,2017 which was attended by twenty (20) youth Leaders from different colleges /universities and local communities.

The objective of the training was to provide youth leaders an opportunity to discuss and share their thoughts with one another and to develop their understanding on the themes of interfaith harmony, human rights and peace building skills. Their active participation in poster making, practice of short messages on social media, dramatization and presentations made the sessions more lively.

Theatre Training

CSC used different means to disseminate the message of peace and harmony. Keeping in mind the effectiveness of theater performances, CSC arranged theatre training for ten people. 5 male and 5 females were selected from the youth group of the partner organizations.

The training was conducted in Lahore October 6th -12th, 2017 by a renowned organization know as interactive resource centre (IRC). The participants were trained to act/perform on the themes of interfaith harmony, domestic violence and minority rights. The team enjoyed their training and later performed in the women's training held at Tehsil Toba Tek Singh which was highly cherished by the audience.



Exposure Program with SAP-Pak



Joy Foundation is partner of Awaaz district forum Toba Tek Singh. Awaaz district forum Toba Tek Singh organize one day peace exposure program in Gurdwara Janam Asthan, Nankana Sahib. Gurdwara is a highly revered that was built at the site where the founder of Sikhism, Guru Nanak, was believed to be born. The shrine is located in the city of Nankana Sahib, near the city of Lahore in the Pakistani province of Punjab. All the member of Awaaz district forum Toba Tek Singh went to learn about this place. Awaaz district forum Nankana Sahib welcomes our team and have meeting in which people from both side share their experience with Awaaz forum in their home places. After the meeting lunch will be serving from Awaaz district forum Nankana Sahib and after the lunch Manager of Awaaz forum give some introduction about the Gurdwara Janam Asthan.

Our team along with team of Awaaz Forum Nankana sahib went to see the Gurdwara Janam Asthan. There is people from Sikh community welcome us and guide us about the Gurdwara. Our teams visit every place there and our guider will guide us about everything. During our visit leader of the Gurdwara give us piece of cloth to cover our head which also culture of Gurdwara Janam Asthan. After the visit our team will say thanks to the team of Gurdwara and Awaaz Forum Nankana Sahib for this great and learning exposure.

After the examinations the result were made and on 7th November 2017 the result were announced along with certificate distribution. The parents of all the girls were present. Ms, Shazia Yaqoob (Deputy Director) and Ms. Rukhsana Khalil (Program Coordinator Sewing Center) were present during the examinations for the monitoring



New Sewing Centre in Chak 425 JB (Walay)



After the successful completion of sewing centre for girls 425 J.B (Walay), Joy foundation started a new sewing centre in Chak 425 J.B (Walay) after a proper survey and regular visits in the area Joy foundation started its work. A well-trained teacher was hired for the center with an agreement to work with Joy Foundation. All the material for the center was shifted in the village on 1st October and all the material for the center is provided by Joy Foundation.

On 2nd October the center started and 15 girls were present in the centers, teacher assured that slowly the number of girls will increase, joy foundation staff was also present in the center on the first day and wished good luck to all the students and encouraged them to learn, work hard, empower and themselves to face the hardships of the Community. All the girls and their parents thanked Joy Foundation for working in their area and assured full cooperation.

Kiran was a student in joy foundation sewing centre in Chak 325 J.B she was one of the most consistent students in the centre. The teacher always told that she was a quick Learner and always completed her task before other students.

There was a big smile on her face as she received her Certificate. Her parents were also present on the result day. Her mother said that Joy Foundation initiative of sewing centre in our village helped our daughters to learn skills and then utilize those skills to increase the income of the family.

At the end Director Joy Foundation thanked all the guests and women for celebrating this special day with joy foundation and he also appreciated all the participants who worked very hard to make this program successful.



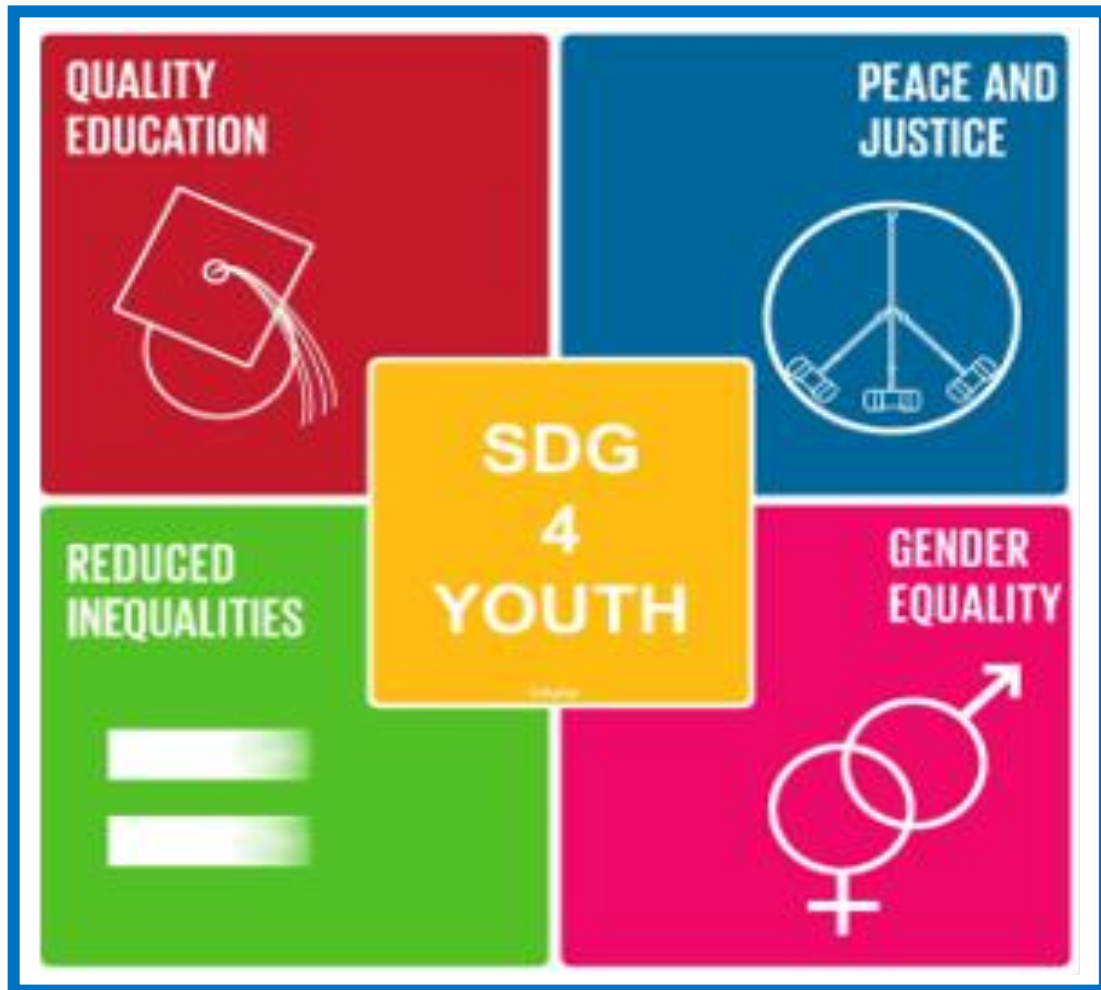
Sustaining Breastfeeding Together

The purpose of the program was to promote awareness on the importance of breastfeeding and its benefits for child. Ms. Sumaira Ashraf (Health Worker) conducted the session.

Ms. Sumaira told that breast milk contains antibodies that help your baby fight off viruses and bacteria. She also told that that Breastfeeding burns extra calories, so it can help you lose pregnancy weight faster. The mothers also asked different questions relating to the importance of breastfeeding and health of the mother and child.



Youth Empowerment Program



International Youth Day
