# CELEBRATION OF INDEPENDENCE DAY








# WOMEN EMPOWERMENT PROGRAM


### WOMEN IN LEADERSHIP - CSC



# **COVID-19** Relief



### FOOD DISTRIBUTION

In a pandemic situation it is important for an organization to identify the people who are actually in need. Joy Foundation reached out to 10 rural areas in 2021 and provided 200 families with food rations. The families were identified on the basis of their monthly income. People living below the poverty line were given priority. The food rations were enough to sustain the families for 2 months.

Joy Foundation not only supported with food but also played its role in motivating and encouraging people to get COVID-19 vaccination. The people in rural areas lack the information and thought that the vaccinations will have severe side effects that may lead to permanent health issues.





### <u>Awareness Seminars</u>


Joy Foundation not only provided relief but also organized awareness seminars with rural women who had little no information about COVID-19. All the safety measures were explained to them by the trainers, including the use of mask, sanitizer and the importance of hand washing.

The women were motivated to go and take vaccines and they were assured that the vaccines are safe and have no side effects.

The players along with members of teams, members from partner organizations of CSC and some community members participated in the seminar. Professor Saghir Ahmed and Maulana Shakhayn Toheedi gave beautiful messages and at the end trophies were distributed among all the players.



# PLANT A TREE. SAVE THE ENVIRONMENT.





Trees contribute to their environment by providing oxygen, improving air quality, climate amelioration, conserving water, preserving soil, and supporting wildlife. During the process of photosynthesis, trees take in carbon dioxide and produce the oxygen we breathe. Keeping this in mind Joy Foundation initiated the tree planting campaign all around the District Toba Tek Singh.

We all know that trees are not only important to our environment and us humans, but it serves as a source of food and shelter to so many birds and insects. Trees provide shade during hot summers also. And the green beauty that comes from trees and plantations is also very satisfying. There are people around us who are not well aware of the importance of trees which leads to cutting down of trees. But Joy Foundation makes sure to plant as many trees as we can to make a clean and green environment in our city.



# CHALLENGES AND LESSONS LEARNED

- This year has been tough for Joy Foundation as we struggled getting our registration due to some issues with the EAD as well as the delays caused by the pandemic. But in the end we managed to clear all the verifications and got the registrations. We got our registrations renewed under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 & Punjab Charity Act, 2018. We also applied for the renewal of our MOU with the Economic Affairs Division, received the acknowledgement and cleared all verifications.
- Joy Foundation is mostly working in village areas. People do not have jobs and they work in fields. Due to this, we have to visit them at time available be them. Men along with women and sometimes children also work in fields to earn their living. So every time we have to set time with the people when they are at home to visit them. Most of the time we have to manage time after the office timings, which is difficult for the staff but still the visits are done.
- There have been certain challenges for all organizations due to the pandemic. The funds were short for the NGOs as the whole world was in need but still we overcame and managed to be of support to the families who were the most affected in the pandemic. We reached to 10 villages and provided all the relief needed by the low-income families.
- Although difficult, yet Joy Foundation staff tries to motivate the parents to send their children to school, who have never been to school before. Some of the parents take their children to the fields with them just for a little extra earning. So the staff motivates and encourages these parents to let them get education because a person can earn more if he is education. The best thing is this that people understand us but the motivation procedure takes a little time.
- Working with disable person is a great challenge. Some people do not cooperate with us because they are afraid we might take some advantage through the disable children. So we try assuring them we are trying to uplift these special persons, so that they do not depend on others. Some parents cooperate very well while some parents take time in trusting us but Joy Foundation staff encourages these parents as well and pushes them to let their disable children move forward in their lives.
- While working for women, in rural areas women do not come out of their houses very often. Girls are not allowed to get education or do any kind of job. While opening literacy centers, computer centers and sewing center, it is also a challenge to bring the women and girls out of their houses to get different skills. Although we overcame this challenge in all the areas where these centers are but it was really a hard job. It took a lot of time to motivate the parents, girls and women to seek for a better for future.



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
